

A message from your Parish Council –6 Nov 2014

Are you aware of :

Cambridgeshire County Council's transport plan proposals for this area.

The map below shows the options for a new road to link the proposed housing development at Wyton Airfield with St Ives and beyond.

Traffic modelling shows Option 3 as the route which shows the greatest benefits and therefore it **could** become the preferred one.

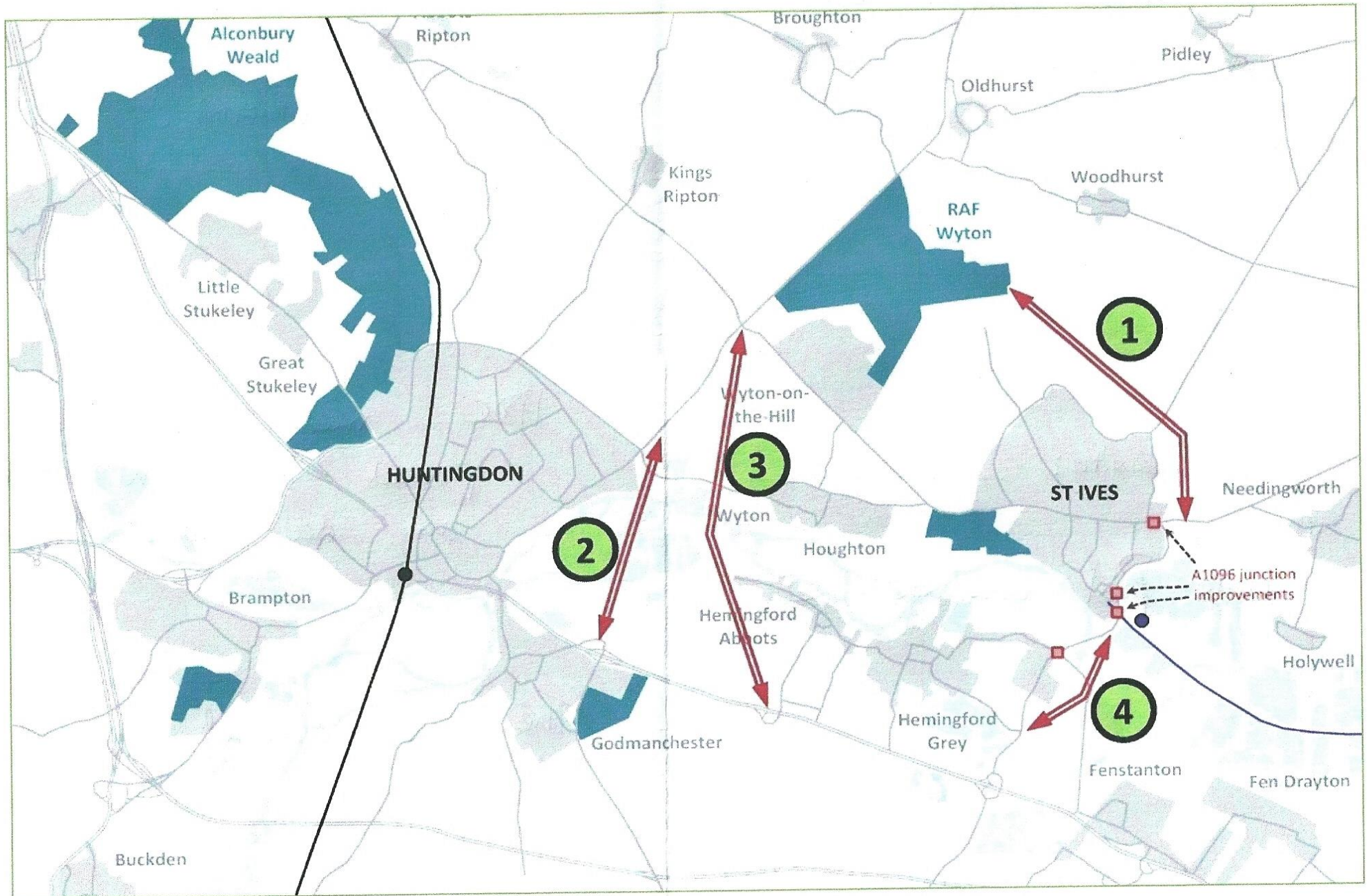
This road could cross the A1123 between the western end of the village and Daylock marina!

Huntingdon District Council need this transport plan in place to allow Wyton Airfield, a development site for 4500 homes, to be included in their emerging Local Plan .(For comparison there are 830 houses in the village.)

The Parish Council is organising a public meeting later in the month to give you the chance to talk to the people behind this plan.

The date will be published on the village notice boards in the near future.
